Grumbling Tummies Café — Field trip/ sack lunch snacks, fresh fruits

Clothes Closet—The weather is changing and our clothes closet is looking a bit empty. We need boy sizes 6-14 shorts, jeans, and short sleeve shirts and PJs 10-14. We also need girl sizes small—large leggings, shirts sizes 6-16, underwear for sizes 14-18. We could also use adult women sizes 5-7 leggings and shorts and all size Pjs.

Merit Mart—We are in need of toys such as cars, action figures, **art/craft sets**, dolls, Lego sets, as well as jewelry, **room decorations**, **perfumes and body products**, **watches**, **sports equipment**, etc. to stock our Merit Mart. This is a way we can reward our kids for good behavior, so we could use your help to get it restocked for the school year.

Serving daily breakfast and lunch. Help us keep their bellies full!

We would appreciate gift cards to purchase items in order to complete meals and to purchase the fresh produce and milk we need each week. We are also accepting any donations of canned or boxed food.

MERIT MART REWARDS STORE

Help us reward our kids for good behavior! The store is where children can spend the play money they earn on hygiene products, toys, books, crafts, school supplies, etc. We accept donations of new or gently used items for the Merit Mart.

Our biggest need is items for middle and high school children such as room decorations, jewelry (boys or girls), Small Lego sets, lotions, perfumes/ colognes, paints and canvases, squishmellows and keychains. We also accept toys, school supplies, jewelry, and candy for the children.

MOTHER HUBBARD'S PANTRY

Please help us keep our emergency pantry stocked to help people in our community in an extreme time of need.

Our biggest needs for the food pantry are potatoes- mashed, scalloped etc., peanut butter, pasta and pasta sauces- spaghetti, alfredo, etc., cereal, canned peaches or fruit, canned carrots, peas and beans, and canned meat- tuna, chicken, salmon.

We are also accepting donations of canned and boxed goods as well as supplies for babies such as diapers, wipes, and jars of baby food.

CLOTHES CLOSETS

Once a week, any of our registered children can go to the clothes closet and get **NEW OR GENTLY USED** clothing to keep them clean and warm. All donations are appreciated but our k-5 kids utilize our clothes closet the most so our younger sizes go quickly!

We need boys sizes 6-14 graphic tees, long sleeves, jeans and sweatpants. We could also use boys PJs sizes 10-14. For the girls we need sizes 6-16/18 leggings, shirts and PJs. The girls also need adult sizes 5-8 clothing and girls underwear sizes 14-18.

Stove & Oven Update



We had a gas leak in our kitchen a couple years back, which caused our program to be interrupted for a day or two. At first we believed the stove itself was broken and in need of replacement. The funds needed to replace the stove and ventilation system were swiftly raised by our kind community. After learning that there was a gas leak in the wall, we were able to have it fixed. The stove was serviced and put back in working order by us as well. We were able to get a new hood system because the ventilation system was out of date and not code compliant. Since installation, the hood has been great! Unfortunately, at the beginning of the year our ovens went out. But by God's grace and your kindness we still had funds left over in order to finally replace our old appliance. After many conversations and options, we now have a 4 burner stove and convection oven. We had just enough to cover costs and we would not have been able to do it without those of you who contributed to the fund, THANK YOU!

2024 Summer Needs




