BIGGEST NEEDS

These are the areas where we could use the most help in the month of September as we prepare for the after school program:

Food Pantry—We are in need of any staple foods such as rice, beans, potatoes, pastas, etc. to keep our pantry stocked and ready to serve those in need in our community.

Kitchen— We are in need of some new large 14" non-stick skillets, heavy gauged medium– large stock pots, and some heavy plastic spatulas and slotted spoons.

Clothes Closet—We are in need of fall clothing for all ages of children, but especially sizes 5-14. We could also use new packages of socks and underwear for children of all ages.

Merit Mart—We are in need of toys such as cars, action figures, art/craft sets, dolls, lego sets, as well as jewelry, room decorations, perfumes and body products, etc. to stock our Merit Mart. This is a way we can reward our kids for good behavior, so we could use your help to get it restocked for the school year.

GRUMBLING TUMMIES CAFÉ

Our biggest need for the kitchen this month is some new cookware. Several of our kitchen items had to be thrown out due to wear and tear over the years.

MERIT MART REWARDS STORE

Merit Mart and the Present Room



At the Center, we have a Merit Store that allows children to spend play money they have earned for good behavior, good grades, reading, etc. on things they want. Our present room is where we store our Team

As we transition from summer to the school year, we are starting to plan for the cold winter months. With temperatures many times dropping below freezing, we want to make sure our children stay warm. Each year we provide a new winter coat with a hood, hat, scarf, gloves, and new or gently used blanket for each child who regularly attends our program. We want to keep our kids safe and warm not only outside, but also in their homes where there may not be any heat. Monetary donations or coats are needed to help us take care all of the kids who look to the center as their second home. We need girls sizes 6, 10/12, 12/14, and boys sizes 6, 7/8, and 10/12. We also need women's sizes Lg-XXL and men's sizes Sm and Lg. If

Reading Volunteer



We are looking for a retired reading teacher or someone with a reading intervention background to help our students become more skillful in reading. Over the past couple of years, we have heavily emphasized the importance of reading and encouraged the students at the center to read. Within those years, the interns have noticed many of our students struggling with word reading and sometimes reading comprehension as well. We have implemented things to help them enjoy reading like a reading program with prizes, book clubs and even story times for the little ones. Some interns in the past have taken the initiative to try and help students by having them practice flash cards with words or phrases on them but interns come and go throughout the school year so it is hard to maintain their efforts to help in this specific area.

In July, we highlighted Ms. Jane in our volunteer spotlight. Ms. Jane is a retired teacher and she comes to play "thinking" games with our students, helping them to learn math in a fun way. Ms. Jane comes twice a week and works with all of our groups, playing games, giving prizes,
